





The Center for Learning and Student Success (CLASS) provides and facilitates academic support services for students:


- -Group Tutoring

 - One-on-one 60 min. with trained Academic Learning Specialist. Sessions are designed to help with time management, test-taking strategies, and more

Writing and Math Clinics


- Writing Center


Immersion Trips-NYC/DC/Syracuse

- Have a wider perspective of chosen field




Alumni Engagement Program:



Summer Advising Timeline--Student To Do's

Ongoing	Submit AP scores/Transcripts from college classes Complete other required tasks (health/financial/photo ID)
June 23 rd	Qualtrics closed. Contact advisor if you did not complete this task.
July (weekly)	Advisor-led information sessions on specific topics
July 31st-August 4th	Registration training session (1 session required, student selects time)
August 7-11th	Student Registration for 1-2 classes. Advisor will have already created a partial schedule based on Qualtrics and major interests.
August 24-27th	Syracuse Welcome (AUGUST 28th—1st Day of Classes!)
